CYBER SAFETY Software Updates and **Actions Needed**

As technology continues to expand, our diligence to cyber safety should as well. This includes keep your District devices up-to-date. At this time, there are two important actions you may need to take to ensure information on your District devices are safe and secure:

- 1. If you use Adobe Flash Player (Windows, Mac, Linux, Chrome): Update Adobe Flash Player to version 21.0.0.182 or later
- 2. For PC Users ONLY: Uninstall QuickTime 7 for Windows

Adobe Flash Player Update

Please check your current Flash Player version and make sure it is updated to version 21.0.0.182 or later. If you are not at this current level or higher, Adobe recommends users of Adobe Flash Player, who have not already done so, immediately update to the current version of Flash Player via the update mechanism within the product or by visiting the Adobe Flash Player Download Cen-

Uninstalling QuickTime 7 for Windows If you are using a PC computer, please uninstall QuickTime 7 as there will no longer be support for it.

TIME TO PAY GRADUATION FEES


