JOB SHADOW ACTIVITY AT SIGNATURE FLIGHT AT THE VAN NUYS AIRPORT

On Wednesday, May 18, 2016, the aviation company Signature Flight hosted their first Job Shadow activity with students from the Aircraft Mechanic Program at North Valley Occupational Center (NVOC).

Signature Flight is a BBA aviation company that offers flight support services, including refueling and ground handling, to the owners and operators of private, business and commercial aircraft. BBA Aviation operates at over 300 locations on 5 continents and employs more than 12,000 people worldwide.

Signature Flight's Duty Manager Brian "Woody" Woodruff welcomed the students, NVOC instructor Mr. Holyoke and Assistant Principal Penuela. He took students to locations where students shadowed Signature Flight employees for the day. Mr. Woodruff made sure the students got the opportunity to see and experience first-hand the responsibilities and duties of Signature Flight FBO employees. At the end of the day the students got a full tour of a Gulfstream IV where they had the chance to check out the flight deck.

"This was a great opportunity to expose students to jobs in the aviation industry," said Ms. Penuela, Assistant Principal at NVOC. It was a project that Niall Mulcahy, Station Manager at Signature Flight, Erick Hill, Area Director at Signature Flight, and Elizabeth Penuela, Assistant Principal at NVOC and Ex-Officio Board Member of the Van Nuys Airport Association, had been talking about and planning for the last year.

"I think that the Job Shadow activity was a positive experience for our students, Signature Flight, and for our school. Signature Flight is looking for motivated and talented people to staff their facilities and are interested in supporting the longer term goals of our students," said Mr. Holyoke, Aircraft Mechanics Instructor at NVOC.

"Signature Flight is committed to helping North Valley Occupational Aviation Mechanic Students succeed in the aviation industry. We will continue to host Job Shadow activities every month for the Aviation Mechanic students at NVOC indefinitely and continue to explore ways to contribute to the Aviation Mechanics program and to NVOC," said Niall Mulcahy, Station Manager at Signature Flight.

TIME TO PAY GRADUATION FEES
