Areas of strength:

- Our ESL program did very well when compared to the overall DACE performance. SIS reports indicate that there were 3,600 unduplicated ESL students enrolled in 2015-2016. Out of those, 75% had a paired score. This is an impressive number. NV had the 3rd highest number of ESL paired scores in the Division.
- Just in Spring semester alone, our Payment Point performance went up 30% when we were able to have a complete WIOA team.

Areas of growth:

- Our ABE program (i.e. ABE reading and ABE math classes) had the highest drop in CASAS payment point performance when compared to the previous year. It's worth mentioning that there were drops in both of these programs Division-wide.
- Although our ASE program (i.e. I.I. Lab classes) showed only a 58% of paired scores, our students were the 3rd highest payment point generators in the Division.
- 863 payment points were collected from 974 students registered in the ASE program.

Worth mentioning:

According to SIS, NV had the highest number of students registered in ASE in the Division (974 students). There is a lot of potential here.

Learn how to help your students become better critical thinkers, problem solvers and decision makers.

Teaching Critical Thinking online series:

Session 1: Critical Thinking and Metacognition Tuesday, October 25, 2016 - 4 to 5:30 pm. Helps teachers move students beyond simple knowledge to greater understanding of what you are teaching. It will demonstrate methods for teaching critical thinking skills and for planning instructional activities that encourage and require students to think critically.

Session 2: Problem Solving and Decision Making Wednesday, October 26, 2016 - 4 to 5:30 pm. Presents the basic steps to problem solving and decision-making. You will explore strategies for helping your students apply critical thinking to their lives both in and out of the classroom. (Session 1 is a pre-requisite)

Session 3: Implementing Critical Thinking Strategies Wednesday, November 2, 2015 - 4 to 5:30 pm.
