April 25 is Denim Day

For the past 18 years, Peace Over Violence has run a Denim Day campaign on a Wednesday in April in honor of Sexual Violence Awareness Month. The campaign was originally triggered by a ruling by the Italian Supreme Court where a rape conviction was overturned because the justices felt that since the victim was wearing tight jeans she must have helped her rapist remove her jeans, thereby implying consent. The following day, the women in the Italian Parliament came to work wearing jeans in solidarity with the victim. Peace Over Violence developed the Denim Day campaign in response to this case. Since then, wearing jeans on Denim Day has become a symbol of protest against erroneous and destructive attitudes about sexual assault. In this rape prevention education campaign, community members, elected officials, businesses and students make a social statement with their fashion by wearing jeans as a visible means of protest against the misconceptions that surround sexual assault. —taken from peaceoverviolence.org

Help Students Prepare for the Job Fair

Many teachers are preparing their students for the Job Fair this Friday. ESL teachers will have basic conversation activities for their students; CTE teachers will focus their students in speaking to employers within certain industry sectors. Below are additional activities for your students that will make the most of the NVOC Job Fair/Open House.

- Update your resume and have it ready. It's a good idea to have several copies of the resume with you.
- Develop a plan to visit certain booths. If you don't have time to visit all the tables, make a priority list.
- Dress for success. Your appearance must make a good, positive first impression.
- Prepare questions about jobs. Don't ask simple questions that you can find answers to in the company's website. Ask deep questions like:

"What skills do you look for in an applicant?"

"What is your advice for a student interested in working for your company?

- Prepare a short introduction about yourself of 20-30 seconds. Rehearse it and make a great first impression.
- Make and maintain eye contact. Have a firm handshake.
- Know your career goals. Be ready to answer the question "what do you see yourself doing in 5 years?"
- Keep conversations positive and friendly.
- Thank the presenters for taking the time to talk to you.
- Relax and enjoy the NVOC Job Fair/Open House.

CTE Class Highlight: Aviation

The Aviation Airframe class covers many subject areas which prepare students to maintain airplanes and keep them safe to operate. These subject areas range from Airframe Systems such as Hydraulic, Electrical and Fuel Systems to the actual Airframe Construction.



The evening Airframe class has been working on a cool project. The project was designed by NVOC Aviation Instructor, Mr. Perkins. The project involves fabricating an airfoil shaped section of a wing from a blue print. To accomplish this, a student will take a flat piece of 2024 T3 Alclad Aluminum, cut, bend, drill, and shape it into several flat pieces.





The main part of this assembly is what is called the rib of the wing. These ribs are flat pieces that have holes drilled in them to save weight. These ribs are then assembled together and riveted into a structural component many times stronger than the original piece of sheet metal.
